Thomas J. Mahler, 79, of Millsboro, DE passed away at home on July 16, 2023, after a long battle with Parkinson's Disease. He was born on June 6, 1944, and raised in Collingdale, PA by his parents Esther (Krauskopf) and Louis Mahler.

Tom was a beloved husband to his wife of 54 years, Roberta (Winkler) and a loving father to his daughter, Patty and son-in-law, Steve Rivituso.

After graduating from Collingdale HS in 1962 he continued his education at Kutztown State College majoring in Comprehensive Social Studies and graduating in 1967. He also earned a Master of Education from Central Michigan University. Tom's first teaching position was at Haverford Junior High School where he also coached football. After two years in Junior High School, he secured a position at Christiana High School in Newark where he also coached the girls' track. In 1981 he accepted a Social Studies position at Sussex Central High School, Georgetown, DE at which time he moved his family to Millsboro. His next move was to Indian River High School, Dagsboro, DE where he took the position of Assistant Principal, touching the lives of countless students and colleagues. He finished his teaching career as a Career Counselor in 2002 after 35 years of service.

After retirement he devoted his time to Community Service. He held the position of President of the Lion's Club, President of the Sea Pines Homeowners Association and served on the Board of Adjustment in Bethany Beach.

Tom also found joy as a member of the Delaware Seaside Railroad Club beginning in 2004 as one of its founders. His love of Lionel trains began as a young child and carried over into his retirement hobby. He designed and built a beautiful layout in which friends and family could find their names on various buildings and businesses. Tom's picture from 2009 was taken at the Historic Georgetown Train Station when he was helping with the Club sponsored Kids Workshop. Tom will be remembered as a dedicated family man, accomplished educator, and active community leader. He made a lasting impact on those around him through his various roles and genuine character.














John Walter Momot
